

IMDA MANDATORY REGULATIONS AGAINST SCAM SMS

From 31 January, please be careful if you receive SMS labelled "Likely-SCAM".

As part of measures announced last year to better protect against scam SMS, all organisations are required to register their SMS Sender Identity (Sender ID).


From 31 January, non-registered SMS will be labelled as "Likely-SCAM". This is similar to a "spam filter and spam bin".

You may receive SMS labelled as "Likely-SCAM". As the sender ID is not registered, these may be scam messages.

Please be careful. If unsure, please check with your family and friends. Together, we can raise collective awareness in preventing scams.

For organisations which have not registered your sender IDs, please do so.


Combatting scams is a whole of society effort, and the public should continue to remain vigilant.

- **❖** 31st January 2023
 - Non-registered SMS will be labelled as "Likely-SCAM"

- **❖** July 2023
 - All unregistered SMS will be completely blocked.



EMBEDDED HYPERLINKS IN SMS


- > IMDA anti-phishing recommendations regarding embedded hyperlinks in SMS.


OVERVIEW OF SG MOBILE
